(Another wonderful thing about Teen Wilderness and staying at the AMC lodges- this is a universally recognized truth among the campers and chaperones alike- is how good the food is. One of my favorite memories from this last year is that the chef popped out of the kitchen during dinner, and the applause matched the volume and enthusiasm of a Taylor Swift concert.)

Teen Wilderness is wind at the top of a mountain and cool lake water after a long, sweaty hike. It's campfire warmth and toes in cool grass, stars overhead and vicious debates about the proper way to roast a marshmallow. It's ukulele music (somebody always has a ukulele, it seems) and the splash of so many people jumping into the water all at once. It's excitement at every mushroom we see on the trail and laughing in the rain. (One of my other favorite memories was a couple years ago when we got caught in a downpour heading down the mountain we had climbed. All of our clothing got drenched through and it was magical.)
